Dog Licenses Required



Please remember dogs must be licensed at six months old. If you currently have a dog or recently moved to Sandyston and you did not obtain a license— please call the Municipal Clerk. You may obtain a

dog license application at the municipal building or on the Township website. Remember to provide a spay/neuter information & valid rabies certificate with an expiration date of at least November 1, 2022 (per State of New Jersey). All dog licenses expire December 31 and renewals are mailed to residents. Dog licenses are \$13 for unaltered dogs and \$10 for altered dogs. To license your dog on renewal, you must have a valid rabies certificate with an expiration date of at least November 1 of the following year. Spay/neuter information is only needed upon first registration. Need to update your rabies vaccine? See page 12 for a list of free rabies clinics!

Remediation Investigation Grant Received For Fri-State Steel Fabricators



As reported in previous newsletters, Sandyston Township is in the process of determining the extent of the contamination of Tri-State Steel Fabricators with a grant approved through the

Department of Environmental Protection, Hazardous Discharge Site Remediation Program and the New Jersey Department of Economic Development. In March, our Supplemental Remedial Investigation application was approved in the amount of \$43,147.50 to continue our work with ADR Environmental. This investigation is funded 100% through a grant provided by the New Jersey Economic Development Authority. At the conclusion of these investigations, the Township Committee will be provided with costs and steps necessary for remediation, as well as options and grants available for remediation of this site with a possible sale to Green Acres. The investigation is ongoing at this time.

Smoke Detector & Carbon Monoxide Alarm/Fire Extinguisher Inspection Required By Law

Please be advised, when you sell your home or each time the tenant changes in your rental, you are required to have a Smoke Detector & Carbon Monoxide Alarm/Fire Extinguisher inspection and required to verify the presence of properly dated smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors, verifying they installed and in working condition, as well as verifying the presence of a fire extinguisher near the kitchen. The application fee is:

\$80	4 to 10 business days prior to change of occupant
\$125	giving fewer than 4 business days prior to

\$4 0	Reinspection Fee

Forms are available for pick up at in the Construction Office between 9 am and 2 pm or by calling Teri at 973-948-3520 x201. Paperwork is provided outlining information on the smoke and carbon detecors and fire extinguishers.

Do I Need A Permit??

Contact the Construction Official

Zoning Approval and Construction Permits are required for certain types of installations, remodeling, renovations and repairs around your home. If you are unsure if you need zoning approval or a construction permit, please contact the Construction Department and speak to the Construction Official, Robert Huber, who will provide you with the information and forms necessary.

Zoning approval and construction permits are required for tank installations and removals, deck installation and repairs, additions, remodeling of kitchens and bathrooms, electrical and plumbing work, woodstoves, pellet stoves, gas appliances, sheds, pole barns, air conditioning and generator installation, furnace replacement, pools (all kinds), hot tubs and more.

Please remember, realtors and potential homebuyers check for permits to be sure the work was done to code! Protect your investment and family by making sure to take out a permit!

You may use this hotline to report incidents like wetland dumping, protected stream encroachment, dumping garbage, illegal burning or incidents with bears.

Sandyston Receives Grants from NJ Department of Transportation



On November 21, 2019, Sandyston Township was awarded a NJ Department of Transportation grant in the amount of \$160,000 for Hotalen Road—Section V & Flatbrook Road Section III. This grant will finish Hotalen Road, continue

through the intersection and continue on Flatbrook Road.

In November 2020, Sandyston Township was awarded a NJ Department of Transportation grant in the amount of \$181,200 for Flatbrook Road—Section IV. Safety improvements will be made to the Flatbrook/Hotalen Road intersection during this process.

To receive a better price on the work to be performed, these two grants were combined and in August after reviewing all bids submitted, the work was awarded to Mike Fitzpatrick Contractors of Oak Ridge. Work is expected to commence at the end of September.

Thank you to Harold E. Pellow & Associates, who work on our behalf in applying for the State of New Jersey, Department of Transportation Grants.

Can Emergency Services Find Your Home?



It is extremely important that emergency services can find your home in cases of emergency. Per Sandyston Township Code, Chapter 47 "Buildings, Numbering of", as well as N.J.S.A 40:23-50, residents are required to have a **VISIBLE** house number by the road for 911 emergencies during daytime and evening hours.

If you live on a private road and the residents mailboxes are all at the end of the road, make sure your physical property is properly marked and is clearly visible. Also be sure your **ROAD NAME SIGN is clearly visible.

If you need a reflective road sign for your property, a form can be found on the Township website.

New Administration:

Welcome Dr. William Kochis

In 2020, we welcomed our first-ever shared superintendent, Dr. William Kochis. We share him with the Stillwater Elementary School, and he has helped our school flourish amidst a national pandemic. He has made many important changes to our school, while still preserving the culture and history within our school's walls. He joins the Sandyston-Walpack family with over a decade of experience in a variety of administrative and elementary level teaching roles. With his strong background in elementary curriculum and leadership he is focused on continuing to cultivate the high level of academic achievement as well as a positive culture and climate.

We also welcomed a new full-time principal, Dr. Harold Abraham. Our new principal and head of the Special-Education Department is responsible for the "Caught-Being-Kind" initiative, the reading incentive program, a revamped Response to Intervention and many other ambitious new programs at the school that we now view as essential for students' educational experiences. Prior to SWS, he held positions such as principal, vice principal, and elementary supervisor. Dr. Abraham has been working together with the faculty, students, and community to continue the tradition of providing Sandyston-Walpack students with a well-rounded, engaging educational experience.



Our new Administration has been busy implementing many exciting changes for our community of young learners. Of course, like all other schools in New Jersey, the national COVID-19 pandemic tested our school in unimaginable ways. However, we have worked hard to curtail this impact on our students, and explore creative avenues and techniques for learning, while preserving the integrity of their educational experiences.

Throughout the pandemic, we have maintained a safe and positive learning environment in which students could continue to meaningfully engage with peers and their teachers. Thanks to the hard work of our administrators and staff, SWS has persevered—viewing challenges stemming from the pandemic as a learning experience. Even during a time of great uncertainty, our small school has truly prospered.

We're #1!:

In exciting news, our district has diligently worked to strengthen and diversify the academic opportunities imparted to students. In fact, leading into the pandemic, according to New Jersey's school rating system the Sandyston-Walpack School was ranked as the #1 K-6 school district in Sussex County. We set the standards for academic excellence by being rated #5 in all of Sussex County, and #305 out of nearly 2,088 in the state of New Jersey, in entirety. This is no small feat, and we must commend our students and staff for ingratiating ourselves into the classification of a high-achieving school.

Social-emotional Learning (SEL):

Our administration was proactive in considering how the unique circumstances associated with distance learning could affect the social and emotional well-being of our students. As such, we instituted several social-emotional learning programs in our school.

For example, every week, each grade receives social-emotional learning lessons from trained professionals. These lessons offer students emotional support, and discuss issues students might be facing as a result of this unprecedented pandemic. Students are presented with the opportunity to freely express their emotions in a supportive environment, and talk them through with their peers.

Caught Being Kind Initiative

SWS has also facilitated the "Caught-Being-Kind" initiative, to further support students' emotional health. Every week, staff is asked to nominate students who have been "caught" performing a random act of kindness. These students are then announced to the school, awarded a certificate, and their picture is featured in the weekly school newsletters. Students feel such a sense of pride in earning their awards, and it has been a very rewarding experience for all. During an unprecedented time in history filled with so much uncertainty and distress, the encouragement of kindness is encouraged and one of our school values.

Reading Incentive Program

Another important program we have integrated into our school, is a monthly reading incentive program. Each day, students are asked to record the number of minutes spent reading. At the end of the month, the total number of minutes read are counted for each class. There is then a special reward for all students who have participated. Some of this school year's incentives have included: a free slice of pizza from the Layton Tavern; a free bagel from Firehouse Bagels; a chance to pie the principal; and taping the school secretary to the wall! A very popular upcoming reward is being principal for the day for the top three readers! This program has motivated our students to explore the world of reading and embolden their love of books!

DEER CARCAS REMOVAL



During the fall and winter, we experience higher incidents of deer being hit or injured by automobiles. If you live on a Township, County or State Road and notice a deer that has suffered the effects of an automobile accident, please call and report this

to the municipal building as soon as possible. We will do our best to expedite the removal of the deer by contacting the appropriate agency Please be advised, it can take up to 24 hours once we make the call and there is no removal on the weekends..

Please also be advised, should a dead deer be found on your property it is your responsibility to have this deer removed. The service for deer removal does not extend to residential property.

You may report this information by calling 973-948-3520 extension 200 or 201. Should you leave a message, please be sure to leave information on the location of the deer (road name, nearest intersection, mile marker, nearest residence or landmark) to help in the removal of the deer.

Fire Department Receives Assistance to Fire Fighter Grant



On Wednesday, September 16, 2020, the Sandyston Township Volunteer Fire Department was informed they were awarded a FEMA Assistance to Firefighter Grant (AFG) through the Department of Homeland Security, in the amount of \$58,761 plus our matching funds of \$2,938.10 for a project total of \$61,700 under operations and safety for the purchase of 8 new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) (valued at approximately \$7,000 each) along with 19 facemasks (valued at approximately \$300 each). These new SCBA will help equip our firefighters with the most up to date technology and safety while battling fires in our community as well as responding on mutual aid assignments to neighboring towns. On May 11, 2021, our volunteers took delivery of the equipment and they have been placed in service.

Tax News, Deadlines & Information



Tax Payment Information

- You may reach the Tax Collector by calling 973-948-3520, extension 202. Please call anytime to leave a message and the Tax Collector will promptly return your call. Check the website for days and times the Tax Collector will be in the office.
- Tax payments should be sent to: Sandyston Township, c/o Tax Collector, 133 Route 645, Sandyston, NJ 07826, or you may drop off your tax payments at the Sandyston Township Municipal Building during the tax collectors hours. Checks should be made payable to "Sandyston Township". Please include all tax stubs for taxes you are paying and a return envelope for any papers you wish returned.
- If you wish to pay for your taxes in cash, you must see the Tax Collector directly during her office hours.
- Payments requiring a receipt must be accompanied by the entire tax bill with a self-addressed stamped envelope. The Tax Collector is the only township employee that may issue a receipt for taxes paid.
- Taxes are due February 1, May 1, August 1 and November 1 of each year. Taxes not paid by November 11 are subject to tax sale. Sandyston Township does permit a 10 day grace period.
- All tax payments are due in the tax office on the 10th day by the end of the business day to avoid interest. If the 10th falls on a weekend or holiday, the grace period is extended to the next business day.
- Postdated checks <u>will not be accepted</u> and will be promptly returned to the taxpayer. This could delay timely payment of your taxes so be sure to properly date your check.
- Interest on delinquent taxes is 8% per annum on the first \$1,500 of the delinquency and 18% per annum in excess of \$1,500. If delinquent taxes in excess of \$10,000 remain at the end of the year, a penalty of 6% will be charged.
- Absence of a tax bill does not negate your tax responsibilities.
 Tax due dates never change.
- Did you pay off your mortgage/refinance? If yes, please advise the Tax Collector so the change can be made in our computer system. Use the "Advice Copy" to pay your taxes.
- The Tax Collector is not responsible for any tax payment that is
 lost in the mail. If by chance your taxes get lost in the mail, you
 are still responsible for the tax payment and any interest incurred.
 You may check the status of your taxes online or call the tax collector to check to make sure your tax payment has been received.
- Take a minute and check for any deductions you should be receiving on your tax bill and contact the Tax Assessor should you notice a problem or have a question.
- Please be advised that the State of New Jersey does not allow the Tax Collector to acknowledge postmarks when you mail your tax payment, therefore, taxes must be received in the office on or before the 10th of the month taxes are due. Failure to receive a tax bill does not exempt you from paying your taxes or the interest due on delinquent taxes.
- Make sure your mailing address is correct.
- Before you mail your check, be sure to check it over. Make sure the date, amounts, written word and signature are all in place.

Senior Citizens Annual Property Tax Deduction

Annual deduction of \$250 from property taxes levied on a dwelling house owned and occupied by Senior Citizens age 65 or older; persons permanently and totally disabled; and surviving spouses age 55 or older of an already receiving senior citizen; all of whom must meet the annual income requirement of \$10,000 or less (excluding Social Security/ Disability benefits). Applications may be picked up at the municipal building.

Veterans Annual Deduction



Annual deduction of up to \$250 from taxes due on the real or personal property of qualified war veterans and their unmarried surviving spouse/surviving civil union partners/surviving domestic partners.

The veteran must meet all requirements of New Jersey citizenship and legal or domiciliary

residence in the State, property ownership, active wartime service in the U.S. Armed Forces, and honorable discharge as of October 1 of the pretax year to receive the deduction for the following tax year. Applications may be picked up at the municipal building and questions can be directed to Kathleen Kieb, Tax Assessor.

Property Tax Reimbursement (Senior Freeze or "Blue Book")

The Senior Freeze Program reimburses eligible senior citizens and disabled persons for property tax or mobile home park site fee increases on their principal residence. To qualify, you must meet all the eligibility requirements for each year from the base year through the application year (the current application year is 2020).

Applications were mailed in February to the last address you filed with. If you did not receive your booklet, contact our Senior Freeze Property Tax Reimbursement Information Line for assistance at 1-800-882-6597. Approved 2020 payments began being mailed on July 15, 2021.

Eligibility: You or your spouse were:

- 65 or older on December 31, 2019, or
- Actually receiving federal Social Security disability benefit payments (not benefit payments received on behalf of someone else) on or before December 31, 2019.

<u>Residency:</u> You lived in New Jersey continuously since December 31, 2009 as either a homeowner or a renter.

<u>Home Ownership</u>: You owned and lived in your home since December 31, 2016, or earlier (and you still owned and lived in that home on December 31, 2020).

<u>Property Taxes:</u> The 2019 property taxes due on your home must have been by paid by June 1, 2020 and the 2020 property taxes must be paid by June 1, 2021.

<u>Income Limit:</u> Your total annual income (combined if you were married or in a Civil Union and lived in the same house) was:

- 2019—\$91,505; and
- 2020—\$92,969 or less

Applications must be filed by November 1, 2021.

How To Apply:

PTR-1

If you met the eligibility requirements for both 2019 & 20120 and are filing for the first time (or reapplying to the program after being denied in a prior year), file Form PTR-1 and the appropriate verification form (PTR-1A / PTR-1B).

PTR-2

If you met the <u>eligibility requirements</u> for both 2019 & 2020 and are filing for the first time (or reapplying to the program after being denied in a prior year), file Form <u>PTR-1</u> and the appropriate <u>verification form (PTR-1A / PTR-1B)</u>.

Homestead Benefit Program

You may be eligible if you met these requirements: You were a New Jersey resident; and

- You owned and occupied a home in New Jersey that was your principal residence on October 1, 2018*; and
- Property taxes for 2018 were paid on that home; and
 - You met the 2018 income requirements:
- \$150,000 or less for homeowners age 65 or over or blind or disabled; or
- \$75,000 or less for homeowners under age 65 and not blind or disabled.

*If you were not a homeowner on October 1, 2018, you are not eligible for a Homestead Benefit, even if you owned a home for part of the year. Deadline to file is November 30, 2021.

File Online or by Phone

The filing deadline for the latest Homestead Benefit Application - Tax Year 2018 - is November 30, 2021.

When you complete your application, you will receive a confirmation number. Make sure to save it. The confirmation number is your only proof that the application was submitted.

2018 Homestead Benefit payments should be paid to eligible taxpayers beginning in May 2022.

Credit on Property Tax Bill. Most recipients get a credit on their tax bills. Your tax collector issues you a property tax bill or advice copy reflecting the amount of your benefit.

Check or Direct Deposit. You will receive a check or direct deposit only if:

- Your home was a unit in a co-op or a continuing care retirement community; or
- You indicated that you no longer owned your home.
